This involved over 100 educators from various schools (Catholic, Independent and Government) sharing their wisdom and work in the Respectful Relationships space. What an amazing day – the sun was out, and the predicted winds did not eventuate. We started the Forum in our Yarning Circle around our burning fire pit with Mia Morris leading us in a beautiful acknowledgement of country. The school was shining, the students were amazing and those in attendance were highly complementary about our wonderful College.





As a lead school in the Surf Coast cluster, we committed to this event many months ago not knowing that my life would be turned upside down with the sudden passing of my Dad, Tony on Sunday. The 'team' of Iona staff jumped into action and presented, helped with car parking, hot food, set up, leading sessions in our yarning circle and the classroom etc. An amazing effort!

Damian and the staff have been an incredible support for me and my family this week. I was to step in as Acting Principal this week as Damian starts his well-earned leave when Dad passed. The staff rallied around me, flipped roles and took on responsibilities that they would not normally do – all with such ease and compassion. It has really helped me during this difficult time.

Dads' funeral on Monday will be a celebration of his life. Please say a little prayer for my Dad on Monday and despite my sadness, yesterday's Respectful Relationships event has made me so proud to be part of our fabulous community.

'Together We Walk'



Sometimes we are so busy moving through the 'everyday' that we don't find time to stop and consider the significance of the places that we move through. Today was a day when First Nations students and FIRE Carriers slowed down and focused on learning about Wadawurrung Country. We strengthened our understanding of First Nations stories and culture and deepened our relationship with our land and with those we walked alongside.

Our first stop was Duneed Aboriginal Land Reserve, a one-acre block of land set aside for the Wadawurrung when they were prohibited from staying in the Geelong township after sundown. In Armstrong Creek, we stood in the shadow of the Creator Spirit, Bunjil. On Barwon Heads Road, our group was impressed by the 'Bullrush', a very tall totem pole carved by local artists, and Lisa Couzens taught us about the traditional uses of local plants. 'Together We Walk' finished in the peaceful Dooliebeal Reserve; a place where nature hides the sound of roads and nearby developments. Watched over by brightly coloured birds, we sat together in a habitat that provided food, medicine, fresh water and shelter for the Wadawurrung people until 1861.

Hopefully this afternoon and into this evening, the stories heard on our walk are filtering into homes and through friendship groups. We are pleased to be able to share some of our newly acquired local knowledge with our community.


Winter Soiree
