Dear Parents and Carers,

On Wednesday 5th we will observe Ash Wednesday as a school community. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Church's season of Lent. The marking of the Ashes on this day is a public expression of our faith. Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Through prayer, we come closer to God so that we are better able to live justly as Jesus teaches us. We fast, which means going without so that we can make room for something else. We can also make a special effort to make changes that will have a positive impact on our lives, the lives of others and our common home. Giving to the poor or 'almsgiving' is a sign of our commitment to justice and our thanks for all that God has given us. Lent prepares us for the season of Easter, the most important time in the Church's calendar. By praying, fasting and giving alms, we are reminded of Jesus' death and Resurrection. Jesus brought the promise of hope to all people so that we may "Have life and have it to the full." (John 10:10), so that with our neighbours, we can go further, together.

Before he was hospitalised Pope Francis had the following message for us:

Reflecting on the theme, 'Let us Journey together in hope', Pope Francis said that Lent was a time to confront both personal and collective struggles with faith and compassion. He also emphasised the importance of journeying together, saying Christians are called to walk 'side by side, without shoving or stepping on others, without envy or hypocrisy, without letting anyone be left behind or excluded.' The Pope called on Christians to journey together in hope towards Easter, living out the central message of the Jubilee Year: 'Hope does not disappoint.' (Catholic News, 26th February, 2025)

Our prayers are with the Pope at this time as he struggles with poor health.

Spoiler alert: sleep hygiene strategies are rarely sufficient for insomnia. Working with our sleep systems is how we make lasting change.

Maths @ Iona – Halfway Already!

Can you believe we're already halfway through the term? Time really does fly when you're having fun—especially in maths! With so much exciting learning happening across all year levels, it's been a fantastic start to the year.

This week, we hosted a Year 7 Parent Information Evening focused on Maths Pathways, the program we use to help students learn at a level that matches where they are up to in their mathematical journey. A huge thank you to Mr Doyle for his incredible work in this space! If you missed the session or want to revisit any of the key points, don't worry, here is a link to the recording.

Of course, no maths update would be complete without a mind-blowing mathematical fact, so here's one to impress your friends:

Did you know there's only a 1 in 1,461 chance of being born on a leap day? That's right—Leap Year babies get to celebrate their actual birthday just once every four years! But why do we even have leap years? It's because a full orbit of Earth around the Sun actually takes 365.2422 days, so we need an extra day every four years to keep our calendars aligned with reality.

But wait—there's more! Not every year that's divisible by 4 is a leap year. To fine-tune the system, years divisible by 100 are NOT leap years... unless they're also divisible by 400! That's why the year 2000 was a leap year, but 1900 wasn't. So, if you're planning ahead, the year 2100 won't be a leap year—bad luck for anyone hoping for a February 29th birthday that year!

Thanks for a fantastic start to 2025—we can't wait to see what the rest of the term brings!
